Alex Koplinski, Bradley, Dies Alex Francis Koplinski, 57, 172 S. Wabash Ave., Bradley, was pronounced dead on arrival at St. Mary's Hospital Wednesday night. An inquest into the man's death is pending. Koplinski was employed for 34 years at Roper Corp., Bradley division, as a machinist. He was a member of the Bradley VFW, Bradley American Legion and St. Joseph Church. He was born Oct. 23, 1912 in Kankakee. He married Lucille Theis in 1938, she died in 1969. Survivors included sons, Alex of Carbondale, Joseph and James; daughters, Althea and Mary Lou, all at home; brothers, Anthony of Kankakee; sisters, Mrs. Anna McDonnald and Mrs. Elsie Jackson, both of Chicago and Mrs. Theresa Wychocki of Crete. Funeral services will be conducted at 9 a.m. Saturday at St. Joseph Church. Burial will be in All Saints Cemetery. Visitation will be after 4 p.m. Friday at Rambo Funeral Home, with the recitation of the rosary at 8 p.m.
