Alfred P. "Beau" Kyrourac, 78, of Bourbonnais, died Sunday (July 13, 2003) at Riverside Medical Center, Kankakee, after a short illness. Visitation will be from 4-8 p.m. Tuesday at the Clancy-Gernon Funeral Home in Bourbonnais. A funeral Mass will be celebrated at 11:15 a.m. Wednesday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church, where he was a member. Burial will be in All Saints Cemetery. Memorials may be made to the family wishes. Mr. Kyrourac was retired from the Illinois Veterans Home in Manteno. He had also worked at Kankakee Roper for 35 years. He was born March 26, 1925, in Clermont, Fla., the son of Alfred and Laudicia Bottary Kyrourac. His parents are deceased. Surviving are his wife, the former Rita A. Drazy, whom he married Oct. 26, 1946, at St. Rose of Lima Catholic Church, of Bourbonnais; two sons and daughters-in-law, Dale and Jennifer Kyrourac of Collinsville, Gary and Dona Kyrourac of Seeley Lake, Mont.; two sisters, Carol Neveau of Bradenton, Fla., Patricia Onken of Bourbonnais; one brother and sister-in-law, John and Mary Kyrourac of Gardner; two grandchildren, Aaron Kyrourac and Hailey Kyrourac; and several nieces and nephews. Two brothers, Kenneth and Terrance Kyrourac, are deceased. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II. Mr. Kyrourac was a member of Moose Lodge 802 and the Bradley American Legion.
