Andrew P. "Andy" Lobue, 81, of Bourbonnais, died Tuesday morning (July 19, 1988) at St. Mary's Hospital in Kankakee following a two-month illness. Visitation will be at 2-9 p.m. Thursday at the Clancy Funeral Home of Bourbonnais. A wake service will be held at 7:30 p.m. A funeral mass will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Friday at Maternity BVM Catholic Church in Bourbonnais by the Rev. Michael Keliher. Burial will be in Maternity Cemetery. Memorials may be made for Maternity BVM Catholic Church. Mr. Lobue was born June 29, 1907 in Chicago Heights to Anthony and Nancy Aiello Lobue. His wife, the former Cecile Kyrouac, whom he married Oct. 19, 1946 at Maternity BVM Church, survives. Also surviving are two daughters, Ellen Musselman of Kankakee and Joyce Young of Indianapolis, Ind.; one son, Kevin of Bradley; nine grandchildren and three great-grandchildren; three brothers, Nick of New Castle, Del., Phillip of St. Petersburg, Fla., and John of Chicago Heights; and two sisters, June Young of Kankakee and Mary Dold of St. Petersburg, Fla. He was preceded in death by his parents and two brothers, Vincent and Felix. Mr. Lobue had been employed at the Kankakee division of the Roper Corp. for a number of years and also had managed Key City No. 2 and Indorante's Liquor Stores. He was a member of Maternity BVM Catholic Church in Bourbonnais.
