The flower girl will be Donna Lee Casper, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Leo Hamel of this city and a niece of the prospective bridegroom. Paul Tenan will be ring bearer at his aunt's wedding. Pat Campiti will serve as best man and ushers named are Robert Casey and John Buoniconti. The couple will live at 320 Front St., Chicopee, following a trip to Niagara Falls. They will be at home after Sept. 20. Sunday evening, Sept. 5, following the church rehearsal for the marriage, the members of the wedding party will be entertained in the home of the bride-elect. Mothers of the engaged couple were cohostesses at a miscellaneous shower in the French Club, Chapin Ter. recently. Miss Breault is a graduate of Cathedral High School. She is employed in the editorial department of the G. & C. Merriam Co. Mr. Daunais attended Trade High School and is employed by the Western Massachusetts Electric Co.

Beatrice Breault Is Holiday Bride Marries Robert Daunais In Church Ceremony

The wedding of Miss Beatrice Simone Breault, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Wilfred E. Breault of Farnsworth St., and Robert H. Daunais, son of Mrs. M. L. Buoniconti of Margaret St., and Joseph O. Dauanis (sic) of Maryland St., took place Labor Day morning at 9 in St. Thomas Aquinas Church. Before an altar decorated with multicolored gladioli Rev. Raymond Potvin officiated using the double-ring ceremony. A gown of lace with a fitted bodice, mandarin collar ornamented with beads and seed pearls and long

pointed sleeves was worn by the bride. Her bouffant skirt terminated in a net cathedral train. A finger tip veil was caught to her small net half hat which was outleind with seed pearls and she carried a cascade of fleur d'amour and stephanotis centered with an orchid.

For traveling following the reception for 100 guests at the Springfield Tturnverein (sic), the bride chose a pink suit dress, black patent accessories, with an orchid corsage. Mrs. Douglas E. Tenan as matron of honor for her sister wore a gown fashioned with a lace bodice and ballerina length net skirt. Her lace jacket had a mandarin collar and she wore a small matching hat trimmed with sequins. her flowers were golden glow roses and stephanotis in cascade arrangement. The bridesmaids, Miss Lorraine Dubuque and Miss Rita Duchaine, both of Springfield, were in blue net and lace styled similarly to the honor attendant. They had matching lace hats and carried cascades of yellow roses and stephanotis. The flower girl was Donna Lee Casper, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Leo Hamel of Springfield. For her uncle's wedding she wore white net styled with puffed sleeves, tightwaist and hoop skirt. Her heart-shaped hat was blue and she carried a basket of rose buds. Pasquale Campiti served as best man and Robert Casey and John Buoniconti ushered. Paul Tenan, a nephew of the bride, was the ring bearer. Mr. and Mrs. Daunais left for Niagara Falls and upon return will live at 320 Front St., Chicopee, after Sept. 20. Mrs. Daunais is a graduate of Cathedral High School and is employed in the editorial department of the G. & C. Merriam Co. The bridegroom attended Trade High School and is employed by the Western Massachusetts Electric Co.
