Mrs. Kerwick was the former Dolores Beeman, daughter of John and Elyce Woods Beeman. She was born Jan. 11th, 1911, in Vernon, Tex., and she was married on July 4, 1931, in Wichita. Mrs. Kerwick was a member of the First United Methodist Church, the Coralbell Circle of the Floralore Garden Club, and the local chapter of the American Association of Retired Persons, and she was a former member of Miriam Chapter 14, Order of the Eastern Star. She was preceded in death by her father and she is survived by her husband, of the home; two sons, Major Roger Kerwick, Tucson, Ariz., and Michael Kerwick, Rt. 2; her mother, of 1224 Chestnut St.; four grandchildren, Vickie and Steven Kerwick of Tucson, and Susan and Debbie Kerwick of Rt. 2; and an uncle, the Rev.
