She was a Catechist for the Religious Education Program at St. Maria Goretti Church. She was a member of AARP. She leaves one son, Victor J. Doran of Seattle; one daughter, Jacqueline A. Dryer of Lincoln; one stepson, Raymond A. Abysalh of Venice, Calif.; one stepdaughter, Brenda Gonzales of Mont Verde, Fla.; one brother, Raymond L. Kingston of Seekonk; two sisters, Madeleine M. Dubois of Milford, Mass., Lorraine C. Stevens of Coventry; five grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. She was sister of the late Normand H., Victor T. and Robert Kirouac, Florence A. Sorwick and Therese E. Kirouac.
