"Mrs. George McIntosh Dies At Age Of 72

Mrs. George W. McIntosh, 72, died early yesterday morning at St. Anthony's hospital after an illness of several years.

Funeral services will be tomorrow morning, Friday at 9 a.m., in St. Joseph's church in Hays with burial in Zurich.

Mrs. McIntosh was born in Kankakee, Illinois, in January of 1877 and came to Kansas with her parents while still a small girl. She married Augustine Boucher in 1897 and lived in Graham county until Mr. Boucher's death in 1926. In 1931 she married Mr. McIntosh and since that time has been living in Ellis county, the last several years in Hays.

In addition to her husband, eight children of the first marriage survive her. They are: Alpha Boucher and Louis E. Boucher, Great Bend; Mrs. Gabriel Johnson [Alvina], Colorado Springs [, Colorado]; Mrs. Ray Hatcher [Josephine], Colby; Leo Boucher, Alton; Anthony, Phillipsburg; Alphonse, Hill City, and Albert Boucher, Hays.

The body is at the Morford Mortuary where it will be kept until time for the funeral."

Josephine was the daughter of Paul Hippolyte Ducharme (1849-1909) and Henriette Marie Ponton (1859-1935). Her parents were married 7 February 1875, Iroquois County, Illinois.
