From the Friday, November 25, 1921 edition of the Kankakee Republican: ITEMS OF INTEREST FROM MANTENO The late Mrs. Kirouac's funeral at St. Joseph church last Wednesday were largely attended, and many of town people were among the ones attending it. Right after the services at the church the remains were motored to Bourbonnais cemetery where he enternent took place. The funeral cortage from here to the burial ground was a long one.

From the Monday, November 21, 1921 edition of the Kankakee Republican: ITEMS OF INTEREST FROM MANTENO Obituary. Mrs. Elizabeth Kirouac, died at her daughter's Mrs. Horace Guertin at 3:00 a.m. today. She was born at St. Valentin. P. Q., July 15, 1836, aged 85 years, four months and six days. She is survived by three sons and two daughters. The sons are Louis, of Momence, Philip and Alfred of this town, and Mrs. Methelda Bellemarre, of Bradley, and

Mrs. Cordelie Guertin, of this town. Mrs. Kirouac died of complications connected with old age. She was known to be a real christian woman, a devoted mother, and a well liked lady by every one who was acquainted with her. For the last year she made her home with her daughter, Mrs. Guertin.

The funeral services will take place at St. Joseph's church Wednesday, at 10:00 o'clock a. m. The interment will take place at Bourbonnais where the remains of her late husband are resting.
