

Lockport Felt Gets Full Control of Canadian Unit

NEWFANE, Sept. 23 — The Lockport Felt Co. here has acquired full control of its Canadian subsidiary, Warwick-Lockport Felts Ltd. of Warwick, Quebec, President Raymond J. Lee announced today.

Lockport Felt, which manufactures papermakers' felts in plants at Newfane and Starkville, Miss., acquired half ownership of the Canadian company in 1961 from the parent company, Warwick Woolen Mills Ltd.

Warwick-Lockport has been operating as a jointly-owned unit since that time. Like the parent company, the Canadian

unit produces woven felts used in production of paper, paper-board and allied products.

In announcing the acquisition of full control, Mr. Lee outlined plans for immediate expansion of the Canadian company's production facilities. New equipment will be installed and the manufacturing area will be expanded, he said.

Mr. Lee will head Warwick-Lockport as president and treasurer. Other officers are: Vice president, Sally T. Lee; executive vice president and assistant treasurer, Leslie H. R. Rockets; vice president-sales, William C. Ott of Montreal, and secretary, Lester D. Carner.

Directors of Warwick-Lockport, in addition to the officers, are William E. Miller of Olcott, Lionel Kirouac of Warwick, and F. W. Charlton of Vancouver, B. C.
