

TRAGIC DEATH

MAGLOIRE MORIN

Magloire Morin, track fore-
 6 man in the employ of the York
 8 Utilities Company, was killed
 while on duty on River street,
 late last Thursday afternoon.
 Mr. Morin was clearing a
 switch on the electric railroad
 of snow and ice, at a point not
 far from the car-barn on Riv-
 er street. A 'freight' motor,
 coupled to two loaded coal
 cars, approached and passed
 him while on its way from
 Springvale to Sanford. Failing
 to make a slight up-grade on
 that point, the motor and cars
 backed up and the rear car
 struck Mr. Morin, who was
 not aware of its approach. The
 body was carried between the
 wheel and the truck for many
 yards until the attention of the
 motorman, Ernest Roberts,
 was called to it by the driver
 of a passing oil truck. It is be-
 lieved that he was instantly
 killed. Dr. S. A. Cobb, medi-
 cal examiner for York County,
 was called immediately, and
 the body was taken to the un-
 dertaking rooms of Gregoire
 and Bouffard where it was
 prepared for burial.

Mr. Morin was born in St.
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 would have been 83 years old

Cyril, Libet County, P. Q., and would have been 83 years old the fifth of this month. He came to Sanford in 1892, and ever since that time had been a constant and faithful employee on the local trolley lines. He was a quiet man, and an industrious and efficient worker, known to many in Sanford and Springvale and in communities along the railroad line; and there was general regret when the fact of his death became known. He was the oldest member of the League of the Sacred Heart in St. Ignatius Parish.

Mr. Morin's wife died more than twelve years ago. He is survived by two sons, Joel and Charles of Sanford; two daughters, Mrs. William Sprague of Sanford, with whom he made his home, on Street Court, and Mrs. Alphonse Pelletier of Canada; and one brother, Alexie Morin of Canada. He was one of the two remaining of a family of fourteen children.

Funeral services were held Monday morning at 8 o'clock in St. Ignatius Church, Rev. Raoul Bourbeau officiating at the high requiem mass.

The bearers were Albert Levasseur, M. Bellanger, P. H. Rivard, Janvier Cote, Augure Fournier and Francois Lemieux. The body was placed in the tomb in St. Ignatius cemetery.
