Nov. 13 -- The funeral of Napoleon J. Kirouac, 53, who died today at his home, 8 Pleasant street, after a long illness, will be Wednesday at 8:30 a.m. from the C. E. McCarthy funeral home, followed at 9 by a requiem mass at Holy Trinity church. Burial will be in Calvary cemetery. Mr. Kirouac was a native of Canada and came to the United States about 40 years ago. He first made his home in Northampton and then came to Greenfield about 35 years ago, following his marriage to the former Zoraide Rocheleau.

A machinist, he had been employed for many years by the Wells Tool company. Surviving, besides his widow, are seven children, E. V. Kirouac of West Hartford, Ct., Edmond P. Kirouac of Lynnfield center, Mrs. Evelyn McLeod of West Deerfield, Louis Kirouac of Washington D. C., Mrs. William St. Lawrence of Greenfield, and Raymond and Jeannette Kirouac both at home; six brothers, Joseph of Gonic, N. H., Leon of Quebec city, Arthur of France, Donald and Henry of Northampton, and Charles Kirouac of St. Pierre Montmagny, P. Q., and five sisters, Mrs. Azelia Rocheleau of Northampton, Mrs. Emma Barnard of Pittsford, Vt., and Mrs. Auxilia Proulx, Mrs. Marie Gaunand and Mrs. Delphine Lynch, all of St. Pierre.
