Born in Lewiston, May 21, 1887, the daughter of Alexis and Olivine Labele Richard, she always resided in Lewiston and was educated in that city's schools. In June 1909, she married Amedee Kirouac in Rumford. He died in April 1940. Mrs. Kirouac was a member of Holy Family Church and its Ladies of St. Anne Sodality, which chose her "mother of the year" in 1969.
