Docior Says

Fire Victim

'Holding Own'

Paul Maynard, 8-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. George Maynard of 10 Claire Terrace, still was on the critical list at Morton Hospital today, where he was being treated for burns suffered in a fire that took the life of his 11-year-old brother.

Dr. Theodore R. Thayer performed an emergency tracheotomy on the boy last night to facilitate breathing.

Dr. Frederick G. Doran, the lad's physician, said today, that Paul was "holding his own" and he was neither "pessimistic nor optimistic" regarding a prognosis.

Paul received second and third degree burns over 35 per cent of his body after a flash fire Wednesday night that killed his brother, Raymond.

Fire officials said the boys, camping in a shed about 650 feet in the rear of their home, were using gasoline and were apparently trying to build a fire in a home-made fireplace when the tragedy occurred.

Lieut. Leo Doyle of the State Fire Marshal's Office said the container of gasoline the boys were using apparently overturned and ignited.

Paul staggered away from the blaze, to his house to tell his mother. Raymond's body was completely burned in the blaze.

Slim Hope Of Tax Cut

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. George A. Smathers, D-Fla., said today he doubts that the Senate will act on President Kennedy's tax cut bill this year.

Smathers, third-ranked Democrat on the Finance Committee, told a reporter the long delay in the House on the bill and the probability of a Senate tieup on civil rights legislation led him to the conclusion.

"Not long ago I thought it was a cinch to go through this year," he said in an interview, "but I've changed my mind."

Unlike the two higher-ranked Democrats on the committee, Chairman Harry F. Byrd, D-Va., and Sen. Russell B. Long, D-La., Smathers has strongly supported a tax cut.

The key to the Senate tax legislation is the civil rights bill, Smathers said.

"If debate on that measure starts as expected in October and is prolonged for many weeks, it will be
