He was a member of the Sacred Heart church. he leaves his widow, Anna (Gingras) Kirouac, a daughter, Mrs. Telesphore Chatel of this city, a son, Eugene, of Granby, P.Q., his mother, Mrs. Louis Kirouac of Montmagney (sic), Canada, seven brothers, Henry and Donald of this city, Arthur of France, Napoleon of Greenfield, Charles of Canada, Joseph of New Hampshire and Leon of Canada and five sisters, Mrs. Alphege Rochleau of this city, Mrs. John Barnard of Vermont, Mrs. Arthur Proulx and Mrs. Delphone Lynch of Canada and Mrs. Maxina Gorman of Quebec. The funeral will be held at the J. H. Quinn funeral parlors Wednesday morning at 8:15 with a requiem high mass following at the Sacred Herat (sic) church at 9. Burial will be in St. Mary's cemetery.
