TELESPHORE CHATEL, 45, DIES AT NORTHAMPTON Northampton, July 24 -- Telesphore Chatel, 45, died today at Dickinson hospital after a brief illness. He was born in this city, had lived here all his life and for 25 years was employed by the Propper-McCallum Hosiery company. Mr. Chatel was a veteran of the World war. He served for 18 months in France, and, as a member of the 104th regiment, went to Mexico in 1916, under Gen. Pershing, in the hunt for Pancho Villa. Besides his widow, Mrs. Eva (Kirouac) Chatel, he leaves a son, Robert, serving with the army in California; a daughter, Louisa of this city; two brothers, Frederick, serving in the navy and William of this city; four sisters, Mrs. Irene Parent of Orange, Mrs. Adelard Beaulieu of Jamaica, N. Y., and Mrs. Joseph Baril and Mrs. Edna St. Pierre of Edmonton, Alberta, and his father, Frederick Chatel, Sr., of this city. The funeral will be held at the Quinn funeral home Tuesday morning at 8:15 with requiem high mass at Sacred Heart church at 9. Burial will be in St. Mary's cemetery.
